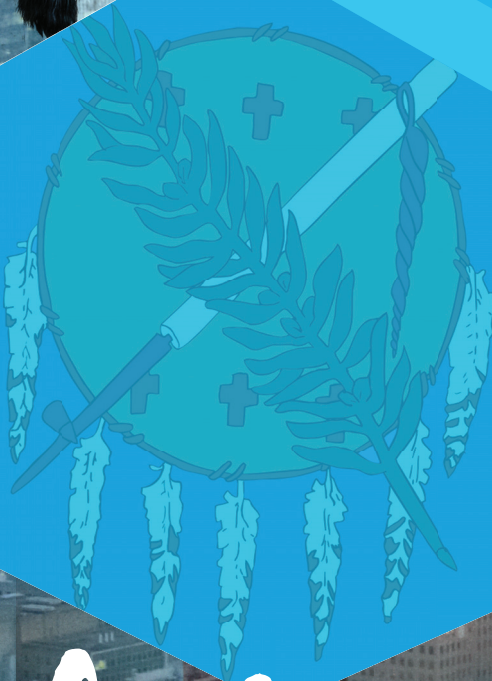

We invite you to attend the 33rd Annual Society for Transplant Social Workers Conference in Oklahoma City and explore all that Oklahoma has to offer.

HOSTS AND PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

This year's conference is hosted by Oklahoma's transplant centers including INTEGRIS Health and OU Medical Center in Oklahoma City and Saint Francis Health System in Tulsa. The conference program will highlight ethical issues in transplant, use of the SIPAT, living donor, organ procurement and presentations about mechanical circulatory support devices.

For the second year, STSW is proud to offer a preconference workshop, Tuesday afternoon, September 25. Attendees will choose between two presentations: Macey Henderson, JD, PhD; Navigating Complex Situations: Hot Topics in Transplant Ethics and Jose Maldonado, MD, FAPM, FACFE; The Psychosocial Assessment of Transplant Candidates: Assessing Risks and Predicting Outcomes with the use of The Stanford Integrated Psychosocial Assessment for Transplantation (SIPAT).



Wednesday's keynote speaker will be Dorry Segev, MD, PhD from Johns Hopkins. Dr. Segev is an abdominal transplant surgeon who specializes in incompatible organ transplants and minimally invasive live donor surgeries. His keynote discussion will be about work/life balance! (Look for Dr. Segev to appear in multiple capacities throughout this year's conference!)

Our program will conclude on Friday with James Long, MD, PhD, Director of INTEGRIS Health Advanced Cardiac Care and Nazih Zuhdi Transplant Institute, who will inspire us and leave us with renewed vision and commitment.
